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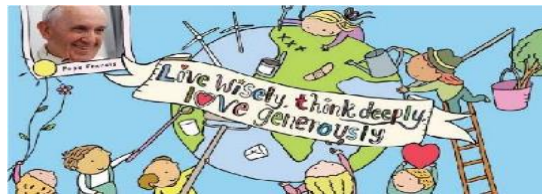

Dear Parents / Carers,

What wonderful weather we have had this week! On hot days, remember to ensure your child brings their bottle of water to school and comes in wearing sun cream. They can also bring a cap / sunhat to keep them cool during breaktimes too.

Year 4 will undertake the sacrament of Holy Communion on Sunday. Children need to arrive at 11:45am and come to the upper cloister hall, parents/carers can make their way to seating in Church. The first three rows will be reserved for children and staff members. Please arrive using the car park entrance to the church and not the Plough and Harrow Rd entrance as the 10:30am Mass will still be in progress. A reminder that girls are not to have bags in Church but can collect them after the service for photographs if they wish. Could we ask for no flash photography during the service, but photographs can be taken in Church afterwards and Father Anton will be available in the courtyard for photographs with the children. We invite all of our Oratory family to attend.

This week, Year 4 have been practising their hymns and readings in preparation for Sunday, they are all very excited! Today, they had a lovely class Mass in our school Chapel, led by Father David.

Next Sunday, will be the Mass of Thanksgiving for First Holy Communion and the blessed sacrament procession. Year 4 will practise this next week in school. For Sunday 26th June, Year 4 boys and girls are asked to bring in petals (not whole flowers) to strew during the procession. Again, we invite all of our Oratory family to attend.

Thank you to those parents/carers who attended our first coffee morning. It was great to meet you all and hear your views. We look forward to holding more of these in the future! For those who were unable to attend, the key messages have been emailed to you. I am very happy to say that there was a real buzz in the PTA meeting also, watch this space for events coming soon!
